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



<u>Calling All Agencies:</u> Senate CSBG Dear Colleague Action Needed!



Dear Chairman Blunt and Ranking Member Murray:

We respectfully request that you support level funding for the Community Services Block Grant (CSBG) program in the Fiscal Year 2018 Labor, Health and Human Services, Education, and Related Agencies (Labor-HHS) appropriations bill.

As you know, the CSBG program is the core funding stream that supports the more than 1,000 Community Action Agencies (CAAs) nationwide. For more than thirty years, CSBG funds have allowed CAAs flexibility to build partnerships and invest in creating opportunities suited to local conditions and the unique needs of low-income citizens. CSBG funds are used to coordinate a broad range of services for low-wage workers, retirees, and their families. Moreover, CSBG funds assist CAAs in leveraging their non-federal funding sources; for every \$1 of federal CSBG funding, CAAs are able to leverage almost \$8 from state, local, and private sources.

The need for CSBG funds remains great. Last year CAAs served nearly 16 million low-income individuals in 7 million families. CAAs provide a critical "first stop" for those in need and help navigate our constituents to resources in the broader community, including: emergency food assistance, job training, housing counseling and health care services. In addition, CAAs serve our homeless veterans and support citizens with disabilities by connecting them to services that help them to maintain their independence.

We believe it is critical to invest our resources in strengthening our local communities and laying the foundations for long-term growth and success. The services funded by the Community Services Block Grant program will help provide economic independence to our most vulnerable citizens. For these

This approach will fail, but in some cases, it will backfire completely. Right now, with the exception of Weatherization, it is wise to simply ask to hold current funding steady.


- Building Evaluative Capacity through a Focus On Key Components of the Community Services Block Grant/Community Action Agency Model

 - Understanding the contribution leveraged funding makes to meeting CSBG objectives.










